## Revolut + Alipay China Travel Checklist

Your complete guide to setting up mobile payments in China (2025)

Pre-Travel Checklist	
Smartphone (iOS or Android) Ensure your phone has a working camera for QR codes and verification	
Working Phone Number  Your regular home number is fine - you need to receive SMS for verification	
Revolut App Installed & Logged In  Have your physical or virtual Revolut card details ready	
Alipay App Downloaded  Download from App Store or Google Play BEFORE traveling to China	
Physical Passport Required for identity verification when setting up Alipay	
Stable Internet Connection Wi-Fi or data connection needed for the setup process	

## Quick Setup Steps

- 1. Open Alipay app and create account with your phone number
- 2. Navigate to "Me"  $\rightarrow$  "Bank Cards"  $\rightarrow$  "+ Add Card"
- 3. Enter your Revolut card number (manual entry recommended)
- 4. Fill personal details NAME MUST MATCH YOUR PASSPORT EXACTLY
- 5. Add billing information matching your Revolut account

6. Complete identity verification when making first payment

Fee Structure Quick Reference	
Under ¥200 CNY per transaction	
FREE - covers most daily purchases (coffee, metro, taxis)	
Over ¥200 CNY per transaction	
3% fee applies (e.g., ¥9 fee on a ¥300 meal)	
Weekend Exchange Fees	
Standard: 1%   Plus: 0.5%   Premium/Metal/Ultra: FREE	
♣ Critical Name Matching Rules	
Given Name: Enter first name + middle names (e.g., "John Michael")	
Surname: Enter last name only (e.g., "Smith")	
No Middle Name: Just enter first name in Given Name field	
Getting this wrong WILL cause verification to fail!	
★ Troubleshooting Checklist	
Card Declined? Check Revolut App	
Approve any security notifications immediately	
SMS Not Received?	
Try switching networks or contact carrier	
Identity Verification Failed?	
Remove card, re-add with exact name matching	
Generic Payment Failure?	

Try again, check internet, test with small amount first

**Pro Tip:** Always have backup payment methods - carry some cash (¥500 CNY) and another Visa/Mastercard for emergencies.

	Ride-Hailing Services Didi and other taxi apps
	Online Shopping Tmall, Taobao (with 3% fee)
	Food Delivery  Most delivery services accept international cards

	Person-to-Person Transfers Can't send money directly to other Alipay users
	Red Packets (Hongbao) Can't send/receive digital red envelopes
	Bike/Scooter Sharing
